

Report on Guest Lecture on "Research Ethics" by Dr. Yogesh Patil

On 26th April 2024, Symbiosis Law School, Pune, organized a guest lecture as part of its Advanced Research Methodology classes. The lecture, titled "**Research Ethics**," was delivered by Dr. Yogesh Patil, an expert from the Symbiosis Centre for Research and Innovation (SCRI), Symbiosis International University (SIU), Pune. He referred to established guidelines, such as those from the **American Psychological Association (APA)** and the **National Institutes of Health (NIH)**, to help students understand how ethical principles are applied in real-world research scenarios.

The session also included an interactive discussion, where students raised questions and shared their thoughts on how ethical considerations shape their own research work. Dr. Patil answered queries and provided valuable advice on navigating ethical dilemmas that researchers might face.
